CONSTITUTIONAL OATH FOR PRESIDING JUDGE, ALTERNATE JUDGE, AND EARLY VOTING CLERK
Prior to entering service as an election judge, alternate judge, or early voting clerk, individuals must complete the statement of officer and take the constitutional oath. The Statement of Officer must be completed prior to taking the constitutional oath of office.

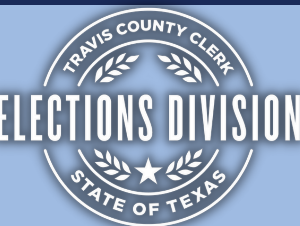

What's New?

- **Pre-Numbered Ballots**
 - Ballot stock will now have an assigned serial range
 - You must inspect the ballots after opening and before issuing
 - The ballots **must** be given out in random order
- **Spoiling a Ballot**
 - The ballot serial number should be used instead of the previous alpha-numeric number in the header

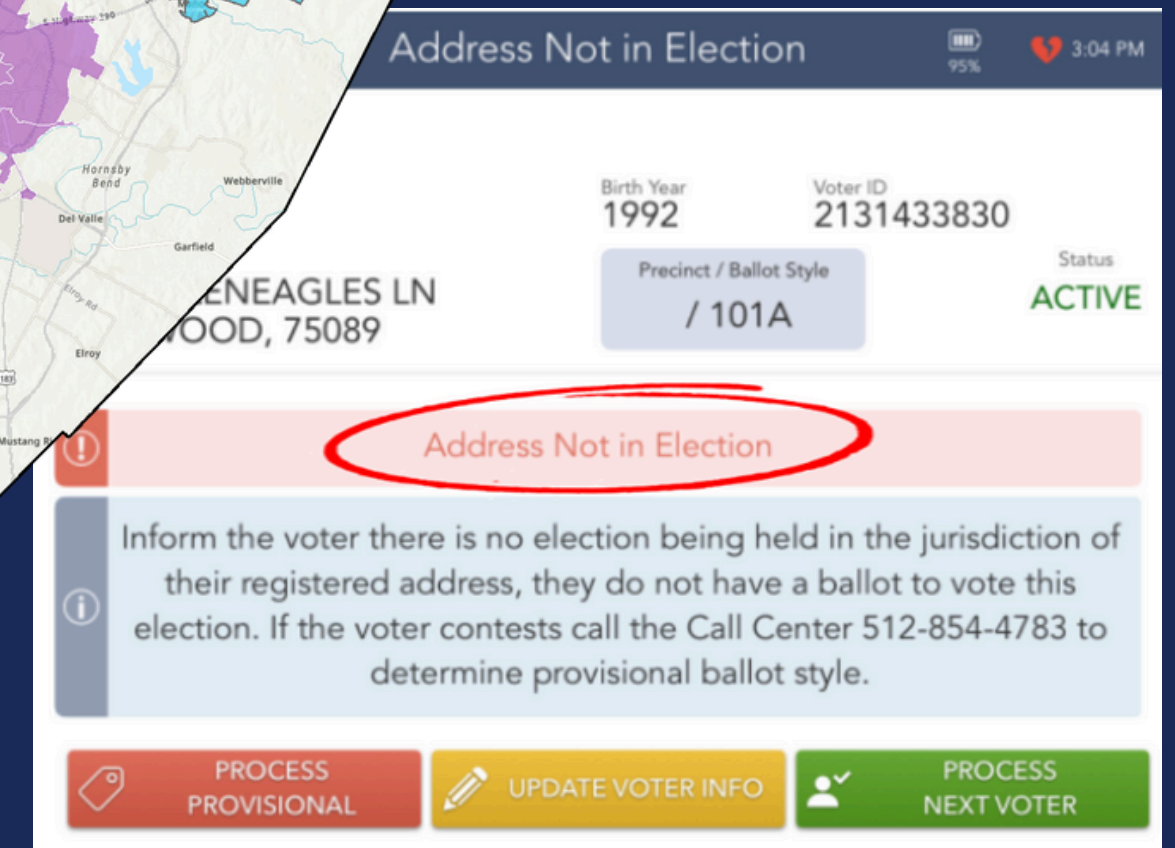
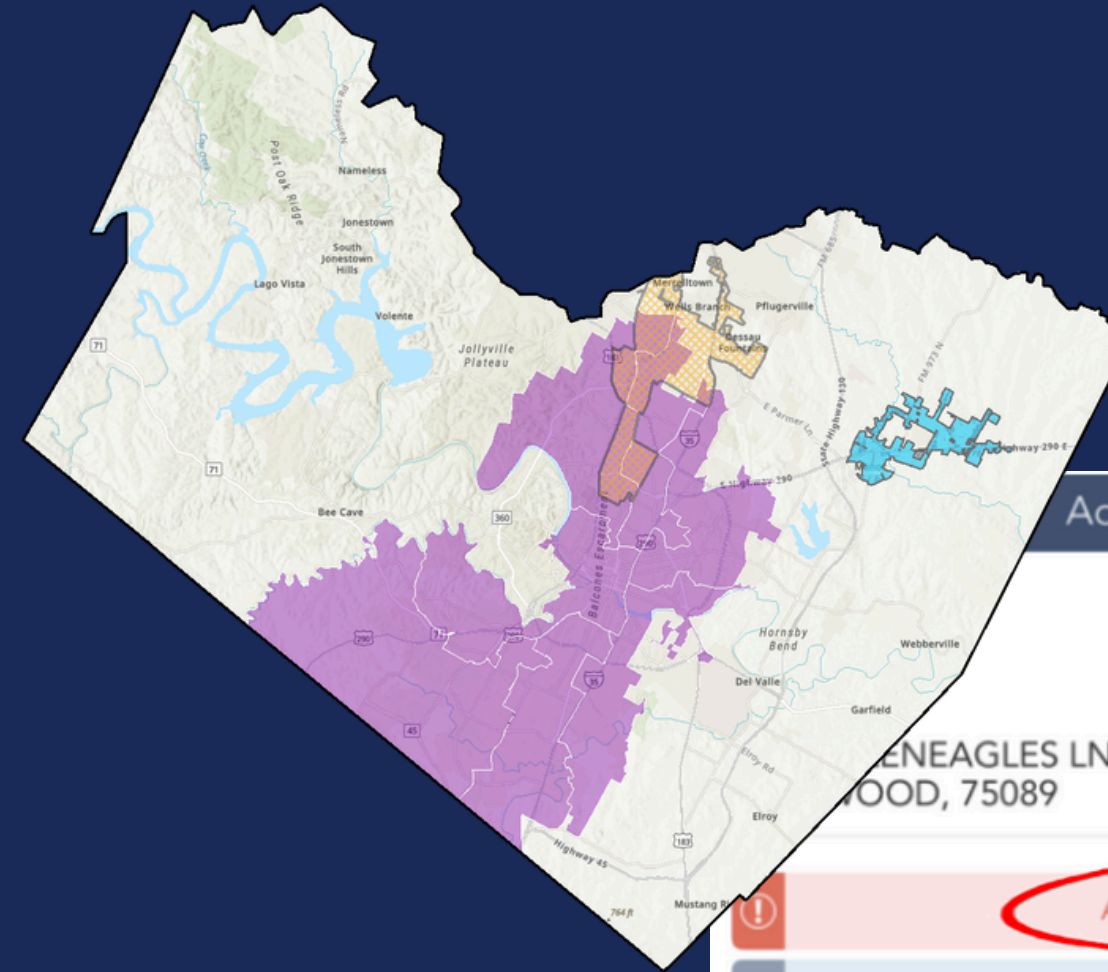

What's on the ballot?

- This election is NOT county-wide.
 - AISD at-large
 - City of Austin District 7
 - City of Manor
- Address Not in Election Flag
 - If someone comes to vote but is not registered to vote in the areas having the runoff election, you will see the "Address Not in Election" flag on the ePollbook.
- No Limited Ballot

Reminder

All voting equipment must be set up and running during voting hours.

- Opening of polls (7AM)
- To polls closing (7PM or when last voter in line at 7PM votes)

DO NOT shutdown BMD's or ePollbooks during voting hours.

- ePollbooks are being updated at regular intervals
- ePollbooks that are shut down during voting hours will not receive updates as needed.

Texas Election Code requires all equipment to remain up and running during voting hours.

Distance Restricted Activities

Electioneering

May not occur within 100 feet of an outside polling place entrance door.

Use the provided Electioneering Distance Marker to mark this distance.

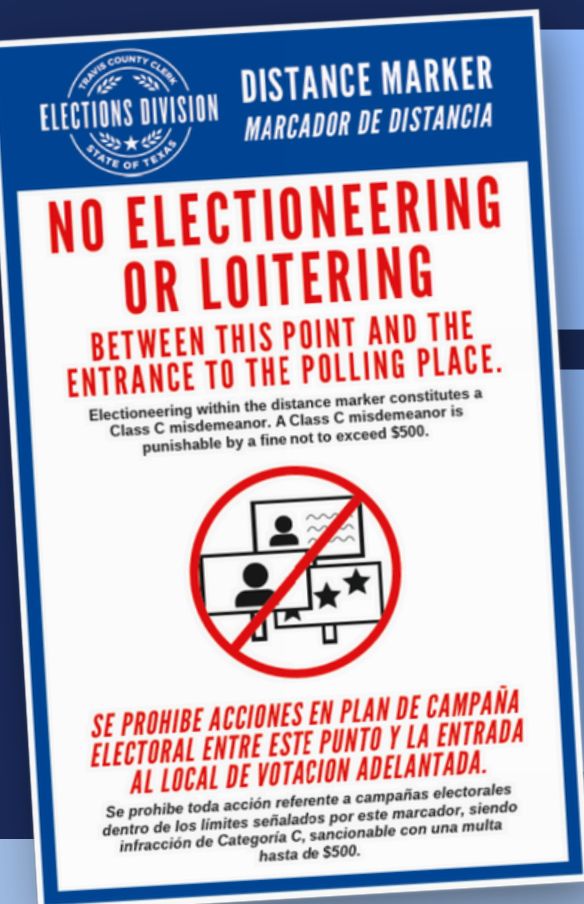
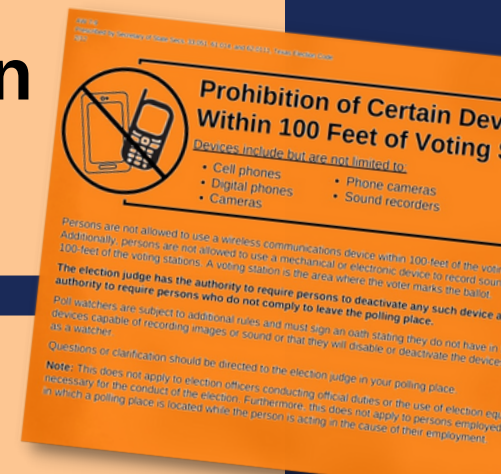
Exceptions: Voters may have written notes but cannot leave them in the polling place.

Electronic Devices

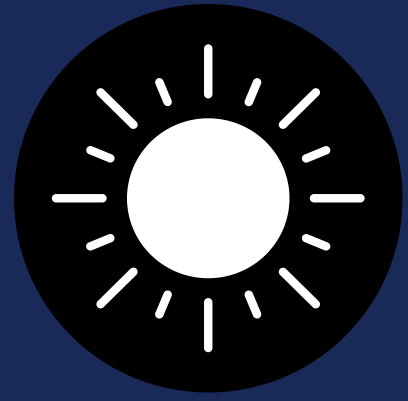
Wireless device use is prohibited within 100 feet of voting stations.

Post the provided Prohibition of Certain Devices postings, provided in your Forms Box.

Exceptions: Election officials conducting election business and voters with disabilities using a device to vote.

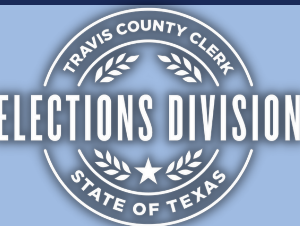

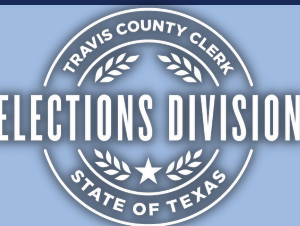


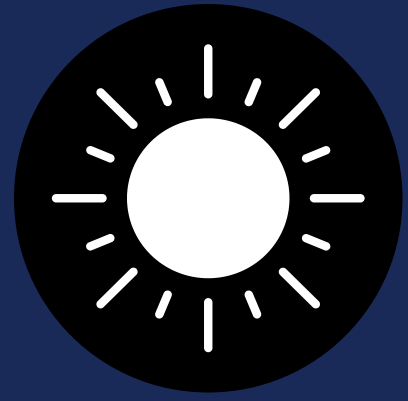
Judge's Signature

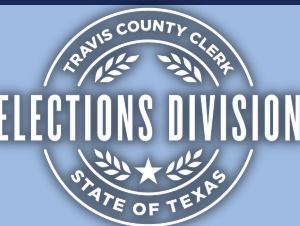




Early Voting Closeout

 3. Clear Envelope Return Bag
 - a. Orange Provisional Ballot Bag
 - b. Envelope for Requests of Cancelled Ballots
 - c. Spoiled Ballots Envelope
 - d. Red Emergency Ballot Bag
 - e. Daily Balancing Envelope
 - f. Clear Timesheet Folder (w/ cover sheet and completed time sheets)
 - g. Poll Watcher Envelope
 - h. Seal Assignment Envelope
 5. Name Badges and Lanyards*
 6. Security Keys and Location Keys*
