L24 ELECTION DAY RECAP: BEST PRACTICES AND REMINDERS

The Force was definitely with us for L24 Election Day thanks to all of your hard work! Not only did we give the voters of Travis County a fair and just election, but we also finished our reconciliation process faster than ever. We have you to thank for that! In fact, 96% of Election Day Judges and their teams reconciled their ballots and filled out their Register of Official Ballots correctly. There were only five sites that required additional review from the training team to reconcile their ballots. We know that it can be difficult to do any type of math or reconciliation after a very long day, and we appreciate you so much for knocking it out of the park!

To be even more effective for our upcoming Local Run Off elections, the training team has compiled the following reminders:

- By law, voting equipment must stay set up for the full duration of voting. Please do not start packing up voting equipment before 7pm. Even if your site is slow or infrequently visited, you must leave ALL the ePollbooks and Ballot Marking Devices (BMDs) set up.
- When you call the call center, please remember to include your name, your role, and your polling location.
- Our Staff may have to provide feedback or direction during the course of the election. Please be receptive when receiving feedback from Travis County Elections staff or seasonal employees. If they ask you to adjust something at your site, please comply with their request as promptly as possible.
